



Writing High-Quality Requirements

Description - 1 Day

This one day course presents extensive advice on how to examine requirements critically for problems and how to write clear, unambiguous requirements of various types. Many practice sessions give students experience in finding requirements problems, distinguishing requirements from design, interpreting customer input, writing precise functional requirements, specifying quality attributes, defining data items and business rules, and choosing alternative ways to represent requirements besides natural language text.

Objectives

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- Describe the characteristics of high-quality requirements
- Critically evaluate functional requirements and quality attributes
- Review and provide feedback on requirements written by other analysts
- Document project scope, data definitions, and business rules
- Describe the components of a well-structured use case
- Write functional requirements and quality attributes that are more precise, richer in detail, less ambiguous, and more actionable than before
- Derive functional requirements from a use case description
